COVID-19 Update

Several groups have been working hard to enable our facilities to re-open for worship and for community groups. Thank you to everyone who is currently involved in the logistics of getting things up and running again within the guidelines given to us from government and Synod.

We are actively working towards enabling community groups to use the facilities from 1 July, assuming all the relevant arrangements (and paperwork!) can be completed.

In the meantime, the builder has advised that he is ready to start work on the removal of the stage in the Kiama Fellowship Centre, so that area is likely to be out of action until the end of July. The good news is that, once the work is done, it will increase the limit of the number of people allowed to be in that space under the "one person per 4 square metres" rule.

Because of the work on the Fellowship Centre, the Worship Committee has agreed that we will continue worshiping in our homes for now. And we will aim to hold a service "in-person" at Jamberoo at the end of July, particularly for people who have been unable to gather any other way during this time. In order to help us plan this, please let me know if you would be interested in participating.
