

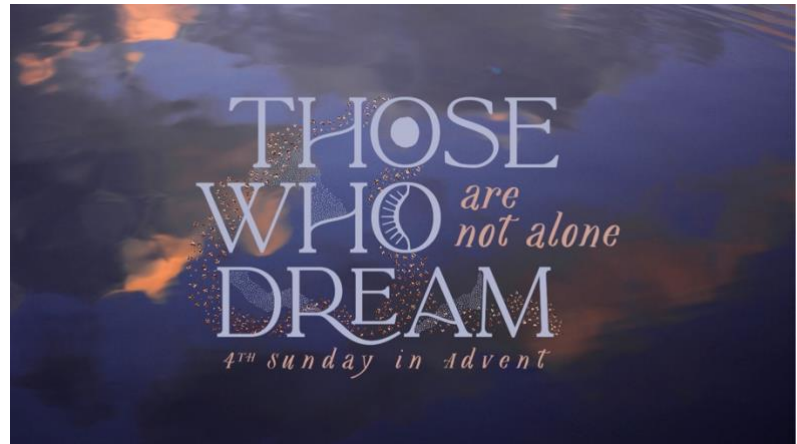
Those Who Dream... sow love

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Listening for God's Voice

Reading: 2 Samuel 7: 1-11, 16

God's Promise to David

⁷ After the king was settled in his palace and the LORD had given him rest from all his enemies around him, ² he said to Nathan the prophet, "Here I am, living in a house of cedar, while the ark of God remains in a tent."

³ Nathan replied to the king, "Whatever you have in mind, go ahead and do it, for the LORD is with you."

⁴ But that night the word of the LORD came to Nathan, saying:

⁵ "Go and tell my servant David, 'This is what the LORD says: Are you the one to build me a house to dwell in? ⁶ I have not dwelt in a house from the day I brought the Israelites up out of Egypt to this day. I have been moving from place to place with a tent as my dwelling. ⁷ Wherever I have moved with all the Israelites, did I ever say to any of their rulers whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, "Why have you not built me a house of cedar?"'

⁸ "Now then, tell my servant David, 'This is what the LORD Almighty says: I took you from the pasture, from tending the flock, and appointed you ruler over my people Israel. ⁹ I have been with you wherever you have gone, and I have cut off all your enemies from before you. Now I will make your name great, like the names of the greatest men on earth. ¹⁰ And I will provide a place for my people Israel and will plant them so that they can have a home of their own and no longer be disturbed. Wicked people will not oppress them anymore, as they did at the beginning ¹¹ and have done ever since the time I appointed leaders^[a] over my people Israel. I will also give you rest from all your enemies.

"The LORD declares to you that the LORD himself will establish a house for you:

¹⁶ Your house and your kingdom will endure forever before me^[b]; your throne will be established forever."

Reading: Luke 1: 26-38, 46-55

The Birth of Jesus Foretold

²⁶ In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, ²⁷ to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸ The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favoured! The Lord is with you."

²⁹ Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. ³⁰ But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favour with

God. ³¹ You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, ³³ and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end."

³⁴ "How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?"

³⁵ The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called^[b] the Son of God. ³⁶ Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be unable to conceive is in her sixth month. ³⁷ For no word from God will ever fail."

³⁸ "I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled." Then the angel left her.

⁴⁶ And Mary said:

"My soul glorifies the Lord

⁴⁷ and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour,

⁴⁸ for he has been mindful
of the humble state of his servant.

From now on all generations will call me blessed,

⁴⁹ for the Mighty One has done great things for me—
holy is his name.

⁵⁰ His mercy extends to those who fear him,
from generation to generation.

⁵¹ He has performed mighty deeds with his arm;
he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts.

⁵² He has brought down rulers from their thrones
but has lifted up the humble.

⁵³ He has filled the hungry with good things
but has sent the rich away empty.

⁵⁴ He has helped his servant Israel,
remembering to be merciful

⁵⁵ to Abraham and his descendants forever,
just as he promised our ancestors."

Refection:

When I was 14, I was in 3rd form at high school (year 9), I had longish brown, fine, straight hair, I was about average height for a 20th century female but smaller than the rest of my family. I had a very usual life. And the limit of my work life was that on Saturday mornings I went grocery shopping with my mother and my job was to drop off and pick up my dad's white shirts at the Lindfield laundry shop, then go next door and buy two cartons of cigarettes for my parents, and either go to work with mum to wash labels off pill bottles or, in the winter, play hockey for the school.

I don't know what I would have done if an angel appeared and told me I was to give birth to God's own Son...

I often think about the young Mary and the instant pressure on her; young, unmarried, betrothed to an older man and now pregnant to someone else. (Pause)

And her response? Joy and adoration that God had chosen her to fulfil His plan to restore the world, to reconcile all things to Himself once more, to fulfil His promise made to Abraham, Jacob and Isaac, through Moses and David, that One would come, the Messiah who would make everything right. (Pause)

I had a birthday a couple of weeks ago and I have to say I am racking up the years. I don't know what I would do if I suddenly found out I was to have a baby and an angel appeared to my husband to tell him who this baby would be. I think about Elizabeth, faithful and long suffering, hardworking but also feeling the pain of not having a child. (Pause)

And Elizabeth's response? Joy and adoration that God had chosen her to bring to life a prophet who would announce the arrival of the Messiah; one who would prepare the way, affect lives so they would see and believe God's work in the Messiah.

The fact that these two women were related and then sought companionship with each other is no accident, it was no co-incidence in the lives of either woman. They knew each other, they needed each other and had each other as support, encouragement and for celebrating God in their lives.

Mary sought the help, the advice, the encouragement of Elizabeth because Elizabeth's joy filled their lives with laughter. In Luke's gospel it says this:

"When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb; and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. And she cried out with a loud voice and said, "Blessed *are* you among women, and blessed *is* the fruit of your womb! "And how has it *happened* to me, that the mother of my Lord would come to me? "For behold, when the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby leaped in my womb for joy. "And blessed *is* she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what had been spoken to her by the Lord."

And in reply, we hear Mary's song...

My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my saviour...

Mary's song is her affirmation of faith, her clear statement that she knew what God had done and knew what God was doing, through the most natural thing which happens to women. Dr Marcia Riggs, in her commentary from our weekly devotional, says it teaches that there is solidarity when we witness and share that which God calls us to be and do.

Mary's song is also is a call for revolution:

Mary says "he has scattered those who are proud in their inner most thoughts." This is moral revolution – remembering that Mary and Elizabeth were women in an oppressive religious culture, living as oppressed people under a ruthless foreign regime. Yet here is Mary saying to everyone that God will dispense with arrogance – dispose of those who put themselves ahead of all others...this is a call for moral reform.

Mary says, "he has brought down rulers from their thrones but as lifted up the humble." This is social revolution – remembering that then, and even now, little things like a limp or slow speech or being a tax collector, or a woman or a child meant they couldn't attend the synagogue or participate in religious life with others. It meant that widows would starve if they had no sons or generous relatives. This calls for Christians to move away from labels

and use of prestige or privilege. Caring for the least becomes the most important role for everyone...this is a call for social reform.

Mary says, "he has filled the hungry with good things but he has sent the rich away empty." This is economic revolution and calls for Christians to not accumulate things but share what resources are available. Mary was from a humble background but grew up in a community where wealth was always worn on the outside, the more you have the more power and capacity you have to control the lives of others for your benefit. Mary's statement draws attention to our need to see our resources as those things which help us build the Kingdom of God, here and everywhere.

While we don't necessarily revere Mary in the same ways as some other Christian brothers and sisters, she still has much to teach – a devoted young woman who when God asked her to take on this role, as mother of God, not only said yes but responded with joy and adoration to the God who would fulfil His promise of reconciliation and restoration to all people.

And may God add his blessing to these words.
