Property Update

As the renovations to Uniting House continue, there are two things to report:

• in undertaking work in the ceiling, it has also become evident that the roof is in need of repair/replacement. Further investigations revealed that it is prudent to replace the roof rather than to attempt to repair the cracking and crumbling tiles. Quotes have been sought to replace it with roofing similar in style and colour to the Lecture Hall roof. This is another significant cost but unavoidable at this stage

• car parking is an ever increasing problem across Kiama. The Church Council has agreed to the trial placing a chain across the driveway on Bong Bong Street on days when we know there are significant events occurring at the Showground/Pavilion. Once it is in place, information will be sent to group leaders in relation to opening and closing the driveway. In the meantime, please *do not park* outside the marked parking spaces. The front carpark is designed to allow for vehicles to move through the area which becomes difficult when vehicles are parked on the curved edge next to the Lecture Hall. While the renovations are occurring, if there are trades vehicles in the carpark, please approach them politely and ask them to move (ask for George if there are any concerns).

The Adult Fellowship is willing to organise the roster for Saturday to sell the books which is wonderful.

Scholarships for Students in Tonga – Helen Laidlaw

Thank you to all the members who have generously supported the plan to provide a scholarship to students at Tupou Tertiary College in Nuku'alofa in Tonga, which is run by the Free Wesleyan Church. After the volcanic eruption and tsunami many people have been displaced and are financially stressed. TTI is the Tongan version of TAFE. So far \$1,000 has been donated and \$A1 = TOP1.5, so will be very helpful. This is a "one off" donation for 2023, and I plan to call it *Kiama Uniting Church Scholarship and* allow the Institute executive choose the student (or students) most in need. Lids4kids (https://www.lids4kids.org.au.) is a volunteer project to rescue plastic bottle lids from landfill to protect our environment for future generations and wildlife. Once processed these lids are sent to recycling workshops to create sustainable products such as park benches, kitchen splashbacks, skateboards and cubbyhouse roof tiles. They also collect used plastic and foil medicine blister packs.

There is a small box at the front entrance, and a large container at the back of the Worship Centre to place your donations. They are taken to The Kiama Community Garden who collects them and sends them to Canberra for processing.



Pews for Sale: Church Council and the Property Committee have agreed to sell the longer of the red cedar pews at Jamberoo and to replace them with chairs. Save The Date: Lay Leaders' Retreat 2024 - Saturday, 3 February 2024 "In Joyful Obedience".


