Property Update

With the recent opening of *Slow Dough* (Friday to Sunday), we can anticipate a greater flow of people and vehicle traffic across the property at Kiama. Please be patient as we work through the practical aspects of sharing the space. If you come to the church during the week for a group or event, please put the little laminated Uniting Church sign on your dashboard whether you park in the front or back carpark. This will assist us in working out how many 'extra' cars are using our spaces.

Kiama Council wants to ensure that only Council staff and members of the Uniting Church use that carpark and they are prepared to enforce this by fining those cars that don't display a Council staff sticker or a Uniting Church Member card on their dashboard or windscreen. Those who use the front carpark without a card will get a warning. Those who use the rear carpark without a sticker will get a parking fine. New Church cards are available so people who need them can get them from Janice or Kath. We have started putting the year onto the new cards being made. Cards to issue to non-church organisations who use the carpark during the week will have the group name on them as well.

A joint meeting of the Property Meeting and Church Council was held recently to address the issue of repairing the leaking roof on Uniting House.

Broadly speaking, there were two alternatives:

1) Immediate repairs on the existing roof for between \$7000 and \$10000 which would likely only last 5 or so years; or

2) The much longer term solution of a new roof costing \$35000-\$40000.

We decided to run with option 2, which led to the obvious question of how to pay for it. Our first avenue will be to see if we can source a loan or advance from sources outside the congregation.

Should that prove unsuccessful, we have another scheme which we would like to put to the congregation to gauge its level of support. We would ask congregants, who are able to do so, to make an advance payment of some of their offering and then reduce their offering over the next 2-4 years to compensate.

Some examples:

Advance \$1000 to the congregation and reduce your offering by \$500 for the next two years. Advance \$10000 to the congregation and reduce your offering by \$2500 over the next 4 years.

This means that you have not increased your giving commitment and the congregation has effectively received an interest free 'loan'. We are seeking indications from those who would seriously consider participating in this scheme and who are willing to nominate an advance amount and the number of years to compensate.

Can You Help?

Lids4kids is a volunteer project to rescue plastic bottle lids from landfill to protect our environment for future generations and wildlife. Once processed these lids are

sent to recycling workshops to create sustainable products such as park benches, kitchen splashbacks, skateboards and cubbyhouse roof tiles. They also collect used plastic and foil medicine blister packs.

There is a box at the back of the Worship Centre to place your donations. They are then taken to The Kiama Community Garden where they are collected and sent to Canberra for processing. More information at: <u>https://www.lids4kids.org.au</u>
