Laudato Si Circle by the Ocean

Strategic / Mission Planning

Over the past few months, the Church Council has been considering how we go about planning together as we dream about God's future for us as a community of faith. Towards the end of last year, we agreed that we need to try something a bit differently and to consider how we might listen deeply to the hopes, dreams and needs of our local community, and then how we might work in partnership with others to share the love and life of Christ with our community. But where to start?

Just this last week, I heard a phrase this week that points to the kind of skills we want to refresh – "relational competence" – which, I think, speaks to our ability to engage with people around us in conversation that is more than "small talk", such as the rainfall and sports results. We need to learn again how to engage deeply with the people around us and to have the confidence to ask deeper questions of ourselves and of others.

We are hopeful that a good portion of our congregation will engage in this process and learning, and we are conscious of not imposing too much on people's availability for "extra commitments". So, we are going to hold 3 sessions after church on Sundays for no more than 2 hours at a time (say, 11.30am-1.30pm) and we will serve a simple lunch. Please put these dates in your diary now:

- Sunday 24 March Who do we need to be talking with?
- Sunday 14 April What have we heard?

Advance Offering

The Church Council asked the Presbytery if it was able to advance the Congregation the amount we need to replace the roof on Uniting House, however the Presbytery is not able to assist at this time. So, we are moving to "Plan B" which we floated in January. We are therefore asking church members who are able to, to make an advance payment of some of their offering and then reduce their offering over the next 2-4 years to compensate. Some examples:

Advance \$1000 to the congregation and reduce your offering by \$500 for the next two years. Advance \$10000 to the congregation and reduce your offering by \$2500 over the next 4 years.

This means that you have not increased your giving commitment and the congregation has effectively received an interest free 'loan'. If you able to assist the church in this way, you can simply make a deposit to the Building Fund (account details on the back page) and decide for yourself the number of years you will reduce your offering amount for. Pray for...

The Breaky Club students (and teachers) to be touched by the aroma of Christ carried by our volunteers who serve each week. On average we are getting about 100 students weekly come through the doors for something to eat.



Lids4kids (https://www.lids4kids.org.au.) is a volunteer project to rescue plastic bottle lids from landfill to protect our environment for future generations and wildlife. Once processed these lids are sent to recycling workshops to create sustainable products such as park benches, kitchen splashbacks, skateboards and cubbyhouse roof tiles. They also collect used plastic and foil medicine blister packs.

There is a small box at the front entrance, and a large container at the back of the Worship Centre to place your donations. They are taken to The Kiama Community Garden who collects them and sends them to Canberra for processing.
